




Samia Halaby's art is collected by the British Museum, the Guggenheim and other galleries around the world.

The Commander: Fawzi al-Qawuqji and the Fight for Arab Independence 1914-1948 by Laila Parsons. Charming, intelligent, wily and strong-willed, al-Qawuqji's military career spanned more than four decades and made even Che Guevara appear a little slack. He started fighting the British in the First



World War and went on to help lead a massive uprising against the French in Syria, and assist the Palestinian revolution of 1936 against the British (The Arab Revolt) before he was forced out of Palestine.
